We know that God's presence is very near to us, guiding and leading us as we continue to serve Him here in central Africa.

UPDATE ON CROWN MINISTRIES GIFTS

Kafakumba Training Center is all torn up - literally! Those of you who have visited here will recall that the center grounds had a lot of copper and other minerals from the trucks which used to use this property. We have begun removing that soil as it isn't good for grass and plants. Along with that we have several of the construction projects in various states of completion now. The status on this giving is as follows:

First installment from Crown:	\$75,000
Matching gifts received:	\$50,000
Second installment from Crown:	\$75,000
Further matching funds on hand	\$14,000
Amount left to raise:	\$36,000

We are very grateful to **YOU** who have contributed to this project. This is an example of how we can work together with organizations, churches, and individuals to get remarkable things done! **THANK YOU.**

Enright Flight Ministry continues to channel these funds to us as well as funds towards our salary and other projects. We look forward to getting the construction finished so that the center continues to be used to share the Good News of Christ through conferences and seminars put on by us and other various church groups.

CONGO SESSION OF PASTORS' SCHOOL

The Congo session of Pastors' School met in Lubumbashi during the month of August. John spent the last week there teaching along with two visiting teachers from the States. The session ended with graduation of 22 pastors who had started their training here in Zambia several years ago. Some of the graduating students brought their wives and small children, and they were grateful for the training that their wives were able to get. Altogether there were nearly 100 pastors studying at this session. For many of them just getting there was a major undertaking. In one area the train runs only once a month! While in Congo John was able to also visit a farm/center outside of Lubumbashi that the bishop had suggested might be a good site for further sessions of Pastors' School. It has some potential, but would need further work.

After we had finished Pastors' School here in Zambia at the end of June we considered not having the Congo session because of financial considerations. Yet John and his mom both felt that God would provide and that we should go ahead and plan for it - and **GOD DID PROVIDE** the funds needed to run the school in Congo! We praise God as we continue to see Him do mighty things here.

John's latest project - **HONEY** and **PROPOLIS**. We are working on a project to give training, 2500 swarm boxes, and 3000 bee hives to village women in a cooperative program. More on this later!
