

An Epistle from the ENRIGHTS



April 20, 2010

Dear Friends,

April 10th was a beautiful **wedding day** here at our farm! The preparations had taken several days (weeks really), but everything looked gorgeous. Although the rains threatened briefly right at the time of the outdoor service it never rained. Jade was a beautiful bride, Brian the handsome groom, Nathan a handsome best man, and John the handsome minister who performed the service. The service was held in the yard between Brian and Nathan's houses. The reception was held in a large tent set up on the lawn right beside our house! Jade has a lot of relatives who live in Zambia, plus many of her relatives came from England so with several friends there were nearly 150 people in attendance. We're including a picture here of the bride and groom, **Mr. and Mrs. Brian Enright!**

March 4th was also a very big day for us - **moving day** to our new house on our farm. The house is still not completely finished (who needs shelves anyway??), but it is moving steadily towards completion. It is a big, bright house with loads of

windows which we really appreciate. The view out our front windows is the lake, and slowly we are getting the yard fixed up. We now live about 2 miles from the Kafakumba Training Center. We both spend some time over there each day, supervising and working in different areas. Our old house is being transformed into offices and a conference room.

Grandma Enright arrived mid March and will be with us for several months. Her arrival always marks the time to begin to prepare for **Kafakumba Pastors' School**. The first session for the Tanzanian and Zambian students will begin **May 10th**. For that session we anticipate about 100 students, but with wives, children and teachers/staff we should have about 300 people here for 6 weeks. The fifth dorm should be ready to accommodate the single men who come, and we are working to finish up some of the jobs that remained on the other buildings. We anticipate a second session for the **Congo students**, probably in **September/October**. That session also has about 100 students, but there are fewer wives and children who come. It worked out so well last year to have them come to Zambia and they enjoyed it so much that we plan to do it again this year.

More big news: Bill and Cassie Bauson from Kokomo Zion United Methodist Church will be coming to work with us at Kafakumba. They will arrive in September with their two youngest sons. Both Bill and Cassie are engineers, and on top of being deeply committed Christians they bring wonderful skills to the Kafakumba community. Bill has an extensive background in industry. Cassie hopes to work with African women and is already preparing Bible Studies! This couple will need our support as they make this big step in their lives in obedience to God's calling. They will be leaving four older children behind in the States. If there is any way you can support them we would be grateful.
