Dear Friends,

This letter is overdue, but we have been very busy the past 3 months with a lot of exciting activities. There is a lot going on at the **Kafakumba Training Center** and with the different projects that we are involved in. We would like to give you an update on what has been happening here and hope that you will catch some of the excitement we're experiencing.

Kafakumba Pastors' School:

The second session of Pastors' School met for one month in August/September. There were about 90 pastors who came from the Congo for their training. A few of the wives came along with some of their children so Kafakumba Training Center was a busy place with pastors' classes, wives classes, and children's classes. Mary Kay Smith and her son Josh were out from Ohio to help teach, and David Persons, a United Methodist missionary who works in the Congo, was able to come to teach as well.

Women's Seminar

Mary Kay was also able to teach for a week-long seminar for women. Most of the women involved in the seminar were either workers' wives or women who have been involved with a women's group that meets at the center to learn reading, sewing, and Bible training. The women had very specific subjects that they wanted to learn about, and Mary Kay is always up to tackling any subject!

Bausons Arrival:

New missionaries, Bill and Cassie Bauson and their sons, Peter and Keith, arrived a few weeks ago and are beginning to settle in at the Kafakumba Training Center. Their house is not quite finished so they are staying at Grandma's house and will be involved with some of the work being done on their house! Bill has been going around to the different projects and learning what is going on. He already has offered some very helpful ideas for different aspects of these projects. About 5 tons of honey was harvested in May/June. It is bottled under the name of Bee Sweet Honey and sells well locally. We really are not biased - it is delicious! The bananas and aloe continue to grow. We are expanding the fish project with an additional 50 acres of ponds being put in right now. These will be filled with fingerling fish from our hatchery.

Trip to the States:

We plan to arrive in the States (Indiana) for a quick visit on November 7th. We will be visiting some churches as well as visiting family in the area. Then we will travel to Florida to be involved with the Florida Family Camp over Thanksgiving weekend. Brian and Jade will be joining us during part of this time so Jade will be able to meet most of Brian's family.

Thank you for partnering with us in this work of building the Kingdom in Central Africa. God is blessing and leading the work we are doing, and we are so thankful for His daily guidance and presence. May you know Him and walk with Him daily in your lives.
